424/18 Welcome and Apologies for Absence:

The Chairman welcomed Members to the meeting. Apologies were received from Cllrs: A Khan, A Mason and T Pearson.

425/18 Declarations of Interest:

426/18 Minutes:

Resolved to approve and sign, as a correct record, the Minutes of the last meeting held on the 13th February 2019.

427/18 Visitor to the Committee:

The Chair welcomed Rachael Gill, CCBC, and Alun Pritchard, Motorsport UK, to address the Committee regarding an event coming to the area later this year.

Rachael thanked the Town Council for their continued support and outlined her role to promote CCBC as a destination for world class events. She had worked with Wales Rally GB for a number of years and introduced Alun as a representative of Motorsport UK. He explained that they were looking for support from the Town Council to extend some entertainment and activities into the town centres of Colwyn Bay and Rhos on Sea, when the Wales Rally GB comes to the County again in October 2019.

Alun showed members a video from the Wales Rally GB event held in Llandudno in 2018. It had been announced that the Service Park would now be located in Llandudno – it had previously been based in Cardiff until 2013 and then moved to Deeside; the 'street stage' was second only to F1 in terms of prestige; Wales had consistently been involved since 1973. In 2017, there had been 73 million TV viewers, a reach of 83 million on social media and 70,000 volunteering hours completed.

In 2019, the plan was to have the Event HQ in Llandudno (based for 4 days), with a 'Grand Depart' in the North West on the Thursday evening and a Special Stage in the area on Saturday evening (20-25 stages altogether). Further details would be released in the next couple of months.

Members then asked Rachael and Alun various questions regarding the proposed event (e.g. location, protection measures, crowd control, road closures/wider impact, ticketing, business involvement, business and resident notifications, approximate timings, potential for video game footage, possibility of a life stream to the town centre etc) and full responses were provided.

Rachael and Alun then confirmed the amount they were provisionally looking for to support the town centre activities was £15,000. Rachael commented that it was unlikely there would be a second day for the Access All Eirias concert this year, so that may assist with budget provision. The route launch is expected to be in mid-May, with separate PR prior to Colwyn Bay Prom Xtra so that the event could be promoted then.

With regards to concerns about the impact of budget cuts at County Council level, Rachael said that if the County Council did cut its support for major events, within just a few years these would be missed and the momentum would have been lost, as it takes many years to get the events to come to the area in the first instance. Members agreed that cutting funding for events is a false economy.

Rachael and Alun were thanked for their presentation and they retired from the meeting.

Cllr D Howcroft also left the meeting at this juncture.

428/18 Matters Arising from the Minutes

(a) Min. 352/18(a) - Theatre accounts for 2017/18:

The Clerk submitted, for information, a response from Theatr Colwyn regarding line 5255 'Tourism and Leisure' (£80,184) in their budget report, which relates to Venue Cymru technical, box office and administrative staff, who also cover Theatr Colwyn.

Resolved to receive and note the correspondence.

(b) Min. 352/18(b) - Youth Engagement:



The Clerk gave a brief verbal report following meetings held with potential funders and with Emma Pugh (CVSC), Catrin Jarvis (CCBC Youth Council) and Rachel Simmonds (Conwy Youth Service). It was noted that Rachel will be giving a presentation on changes to Conwy's Youth Service provision at the next Council meeting (April) and the Clerk will update and submit her report to that meeting, to include recommendations regarding working more closely in partnership with other bodies who involve young people locally.

The Clerk also informed the Committee she would be attending the Wales Audit Office Workshop Event on Youth Engagement on Thursday 29th March.

Resolved to note the Clerk's update and await the updated report to Council.

(c) Min. 354/18 - Dog Exclusion Zones:

The Clerk submitted, for information, a response from CCBC which confirmed that the current seasonal exclusion from 1 May to 30 September is still in place. Members discussed how the situation was frustrating and that dog owners are not taking responsibility for picking up after their dogs and that complaints about the issue are rising. It was also noted that CCBC have not yet appointed a replacement to Kingdom, as some County Councillors are reluctant to support greater enforcement action.

Resolved to receive and note the response.

(d) Min. 357/18 - Members' Allowances:

The Clerk gave a brief verbal report regarding Members' Allowances and advised that the existing payroll software could still be used for the 4 staff members and the 3 councillors who have claimed their basic allowance for 2018/19.

The Clerk also informed the Committee that she had sent a formal request to HMRC to apply for an exemption from tax/NI on the basic allowance, but that no response had been received as yet.

Resolved to note the Clerk's report.

429/18 Finance:

(a) IMAGINE Colwyn Bay – Notes from a meeting of the Steering Group, held on 6th March and a reminder about the launch event on 9th April.

Resolved to receive and note the Steering Group meeting notes.

(b) Bay Life - Cllr C Hughes and the Clerk gave a brief verbal report on the March meeting of the Bay Life Strategic Management Board. The key points were: Housing Renewal – the next phase will cover Abergele Road, from Greenfield Road to Bay View Road, together with Bay View Road and Back Bay View Road; Waterfront – dog mess issues mentioned; 7 Abergele Road – there had been some delays due to structural steel works, but hope to complete building works and transfer to Trust by end of July; Eirias Development Plan – waiting for report regarding internal development of leisure facilities; Douglas Road – Delyth (Legal Services) is now Project Coordinator, the project potentially involves a new family centre, CREST buildings, incorporating Communities For Work, Glyn Ward Invest Local, SPYCE and the rear annexe of Town Hall (which has the potential to open up onto Douglas Road).

(c) Play Equipment:

(i) The Clerk submitted, for information, confirmation that an application to the National Lottery 'Awards for All' grant pot by CCBC had not been successful. The Clerk said she would share feedback from the application, when it has been received.

Resolved to note the information.

(ii) The Clerk submitted, for information and consideration, a request from Rhys Eden, CCBC Inspector, to use some of the Play Equipment funding pledged by this Council towards non-critical repairs to benches and timber play equipment. The Clerk advised the Committee that further information on the level of spending so far (on priority works) had been requested, but not yet been received.



Members also discussed the recent press report regarding graffiti in the park and felt that the report had been over-exaggerated, as there was just a small wooden shelter with names on it and no graffiti on any of the park equipment.

Resolved to Defer consideration of the request from Rhys until a response had been received and/or a meeting held to discuss what had been spent so far and what other priority works remain.

432/18 External Audit:

The Clerk submitted, for information, an e-mail and letter regarding changes to the External Audit regime from 2020/21 onwards.

Resolved to note the correspondence and await further information in due course.

433/18 Appointment of Chair/Vice-Chair for 2019/20:

The Clerk submitted, for information, a section of the new Standing Orders, which require the Council to appoint the Chairman (and Vice-Chair) of the Standing Committees. The Members discussed how it was important for committee members to have confidence in their Chair and felt, therefore, that the Chair should be elected by the Committee itself and not the Council.

Resolved to recommend that the Council amend Standing Order 4(d)(vi) to allow the Standing Committees to appoint their Chair.

434/18 Local Members Ward Allowances:

The Clerk submitted further information in regard to Cllr J Pearson's project proposal deferred from the last meeting. The proposal had been referred to the General Purpose & Planning Committee meeting on the 19th March, where the Committee was happy in principle to support the proposal, after asking for the reasons the camera was needed and confirming that the local police were supportive. The General Purpose & Planning Committee had recommended the proposal be approved.

Resolved to approve the project proposal and authorise payment.

The Clerk read out, for information, an update from the Mayor, Cllr S Williams, confirming that sales for the Mayor's Masquerade Ball had been 'poor' and the Mayor has therefore, reluctantly, made the decision to cancel the event.

Resolved to note and endorse the Mayor's decision to cancel the event.

(a) Youth Grants: The Clerk submitted, for consideration, additional information provided by the Orme Explorer Scouts in connection with the Youth Grant application for 2018/19.

Resolved to note the additional information provided in support of the application and to authorise payment of the Youth Grant to Orme Explorer Scouts.

(b) Events Grants:

(i) The Clerk submitted a Service Level Agreement from CAIS, who it was noted had agreed to administer the grant funding for the 2019 Forties Festival (instead of the North West Wales Food Group). Members welcomed the decision and felt it was a positive move.

Resolved to note the SLA and authorise payment of the event funding to CAIS.

(ii) CCBC Events 2019:

The Committee discussed the request made by Rachael Gill (CCBC) and Alun Pritchard (Motorsport UK), earlier in the meeting, for funding towards the Colwyn Bay/Rhos on Sea activities, to be held on Saturday 5th October 2019.

Members expressed concern over the carbon footprint of motorsports generally and queried whether road stages of the event send a wrong message to young drivers. A Member queried whether free activities re: sustainability / de-carbonisation, could be offered to help to offset the environmental damage of motorsports.

Resolved to recommend approving a payment of £15,000 (£5,000 from the Events budget, £10,000 from Access All Eirias budget 2019/20) towards Colwyn Bay / Rhos on Sea town centre activities, in connection with the Wales Rally GB event.

Further Resolved to request that the Clerk contacts Rachael Gill to explain concern about the Carbon footprint and the message we are sending our future generations, and ask whether some appropriate 'green' activities could be included in wider town centre activities, to help mitigate against this

(c) Small Grants:

(i) The Clerk submitted for consideration small grant applications received for Q4, as detailed in Schedule 'B' attached.

Resolved to recommend approval of grant applications, A, B, C, D, E and F, as detailed in Schedule 'B' attached.

(ii) The Clerk submitted, for consideration, a request to make a donation from any remaining balance to the Sir John Henry Morris Jones Trust Fund and the Llandrillo yn Rhos Charities.

Resolved to donate £1,500 to the Sir John Henry Morris Jones Trust Fund, and £890 to the Llandrillo yn Rhos Charities from the balance remaining in the small grants budget for 2018/19.

(iii) The Clerk reminded the Committee that any underspend in the Councillor Allowance budget for 2018/19 will be transferred to the small grants budget for

2019/20. The amount was not yet known and the Clerk also requested that any Councillors travel claims to be submitted as soon as possible.

Resolved to note.
