# MINUTES OF A POLICY AND FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE BAY OF COLWYN TOWN COUNCIL, HELD REMOTELY (VIA ZOOM) AT 6.30 PM ON WEDNESDAY 17<sup>TH</sup> JANUARY 2024

# 298/23 Welcome and Apologies for Absence

The Chair welcomed members to the meeting. Apologies for absence were received from Cllrs: D Carr, N Coverley, A Khan, D Jones, S McAllister, L Wilkins

# 299/23 Declarations of Interest:

Members were reminded that they must declare the existence and nature of any personal and/or prejudicial interests.

Cllr CH declared a personal/prejudicial interest in agenda items 3(b), as a Director of Together for Colwyn Bay and 4, in connection with the large grant application for Colwyn Bay Environment Federation.

- Newly elected Cllr Ann Jones joined the meeting at this juncture.

#### 300/23 Events Grants 2024/25

a) Beach of Dreams: The Clerk shared further information with members about the Arts Council England (ACE) bid by Kinetika, which includes a national artist commission for eight communities, with five across England and one each in Wales, Scotland and Ireland, as an inter-nation collaboration. It was noted that further discussions had taken place in the past week with Judith Sharp and Sian Young (CCBC) and Neil Dunsire from TAPE about the potential activity in the Bay of Colwyn for the summer of 24, in the lead up to the national event in May 25. This had a good fit with a current TAPE 'Beneath the Waves' project, part- funded by the Arts Council Wales (ACW), and it is hoped that a national artist co-commission could include involvement with TAPE.

Resolved to ratify the signing of the partnership agreement, which is required for the submission of the funding bid to ACE later this week.

b) Prom Xtra and Pride Events – May 24: It was noted that further information (a detailed budget) had now been received from T4CB and that they would require £20,000 in Events Grant funding from the Town Council, if Prom Xtra was not able to go ahead this year and we wished them to put on a two-day event, to maximise benefit from the road closure / event infrastructure. This was instead of the £5k - £7k request for the one-day Pride Event. The second day of activity would not be themed as 'Prom Xtra' and may have some different elements, though it would still

be aimed at families. It was noted that the budget for the two day event included approx. £7k for staging, which it may be possible to hire much cheaper from the CCBC Events Team (if there funding has come through and they have been able to make some capital purchases for events equipment).

The CCBC Events Team had requested increased funding of £15k (a £5k increase on the usual contribution of £10k from the Town Council, which had already been approved) to be able to continue with Prom Xtra in May 24, as they do not have access to any other grant or capital events funding this year to subsidise the costs of the event. If this goes ahead, the one-day Pride Event will only need £5k from the Events budget.

Resolved to await further information from CCBC Events Teams to give a more detailed breakdown of costs for Prom Xtra and to recommend an overall budget of £20k is approved to cover both events, to enable the organisors to get together to collaborate and support each other and agree how to best maximise the benefits and impact of both events from the funding available.

# 301/23 Large Grants 2023/24:

Members considered the large grant applications for 2024/25, for inclusion in the Annual Budget Estimates.

Resolved to recommend:

- a) Approval of grants for applicants A, B, C, D and E, as detailed in Schedule 'A' attached, subject to:
  - i) Payment of the second instalment to applicant B being subject to receipt of a satisfactory and detailed report on the number of clients assisted and types of queries from the Bay of Colwyn area during the 2022/23 financial year.
  - ii) Applicant D submitting data on the number of clients they have supported from the Bay of Colwyn area in 2023.
  - iii) Applicant E being asked to provide more data and testimonials etc with any future large grant application.
- b) Application G was deferred pending receipt of additional information on how many team members live within the Bay of Colwyn boundary.

### 302/23 Photocopier Lease:

The Clerk submitted a summary of the three quotations received for a new lease for a multi-purpose copier/scanner/printer for the office, given that the existing five-year lease with Canda Copying has now come to the end of its term. A discussion took place about the pros and cons of a new machine over an older or reconditioned model and it was noted that all quotes now included a drop box and wi-fi printing capability. Two companies had been shortlisted, based on their competitive quotes and experience/references from other councils and there was less than (£1 pa between these two quotes, based on a new machine and current (past year) printing quantities.

Resolved to delegate authority to the Clerk to check the print quality of the two
